Application Procedure

Further Education College, Clonakilty welcomes applications from the following

- Leaving Certificate Students
- Leaving Certificate Applied Students
- Individuals who are currently unemployed
- Adults or mature students who would like to return to the workforce
- Individuals who would like to learn new skills or update existing skills

How to Apply

- Select the course which you wish to pursue
- Complete the application form and forward to college. Ensure you have included a passport photograph. Applications are processed on a first come first served basis so early application is strongly advised.
- You will then receive a letter acknowledging receipt of your application form. This letter will outline costs and any necessary equipment for your course. Candidates will also be informed of the commencement date for their course.

Candidates on our courses are entitled to apply for maintenance grants. These grants are means tested. Once a candidate qualifies for a grant the amount they receive will depend on their distance from the college. VTOS – Vocational Training Opportunity Scheme

The Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (V.T.O.S.) is a special range of courses designed to meet the education and training needs of unemployed people.

The aim is to give unemployed people education and opportunities which will develop their employability.

To prepare people to go to paid employment or to further opportunities leading to paid employment.

BTEA – Back to Education Allowance

The Back to Education Initiative (BTEI) provides part-time Further Education programmes for young people and adults. This aim is to give people an opportunity to combine a return to learning with family, work and other responsibilities.

Anyone who has full-time education can take part in a course being offered, but priority will be given to those with less than upper second level education. All the programmes are FETAC accredited, usually Level 3 to Level 6.

Individuals will have different entitlements as regards payment for courses. Those in receipt of unemployment payments or means-tested social welfare benefits, and holders of medical cards and GP only cards, and their dependants, are entitled to free tuition. Other unwaged people with less than upper second level education will be entitled to a reduction in fees. The remainder will be charged fees.
